About



BBC Children in Need's vision is that every child in the UK has a safe, happy and secure childhood and the chance to reach their potential.

Funding Programmes

Small Grants - For grants of up to £10,000 in one year a short application form focuses on the differences made to the lives of disadvantaged children and young people. This is assessed, usually by telephone interview, with a response roughly 9 weeks after application. There are 4 decision points in the year, with applications received by 1st March, June, September and December, hearing the outcome in early May, August, November and end of February.

Main grants (over £10,000 for up to 3 years) have a two stage application process. An initial application eliminates those with low prospects of success at an early stage, with those who are successful invited to make a full application. The focus of our decision making is on the outcomes for children and young people and the potential learning to be secured. There are 3 decision points in the year, with applications received by 15 January, May and September being decided by mid-June, October and February respectively.

Funding Programmes

Grants are currently limited to £500 max for a group; a 5 year rule applies to repeat applications. Applications are considered by a Local Advisory Committee meeting 3 times a year, currently in February, June and October. Closing dates for each meeting are normally 15th January, 15th May and 15th September.

In addition we now have a limited amount of funding available for NI charitable projects **outside** of County Londonderry: £2,000 max size of grant.

About

The Prince's Trust supports 13 to 30 year olds who are unemployed and those struggling at school and at risk of exclusion.

Around one in five young people in the UK are not in work, education or training. Youth unemployment costs the UK economy £10 million a day in lost productivity, while youth crime costs £1 billion every year.

Many of the young people we help are in or leaving care, facing issues such as homelessness or mental health problems, or have been in trouble with the law.

Our programmes give young people the practical and financial support they need to stabilise their lives. We help develop key skills, confidence and motivation, enabling young people to move into work, education or training.

We help young people:

- Develop skills, prepare for work and improve their confidence through a structured [12-week personal development course](#), individually tailored development programmes and short engagement programmes
- Improve motivation and attendance at school through our network of [xl clubs](#)
- Work out whether self-employment is right for them by helping them test their business ideas, write plans and start their own businesses, or achieve other goals in education, training, volunteering or other work
- Overcome barriers and get their lives working with cash awards of between £50 and £500, and mentor support for those leaving care or prison
- Develop personal and social skills through residential schemes, group activities and tailored one-to-one support
