### New Trustee

The Fermanagh Trust is delighted Mr Ernie Fisher has recently become a Trustee. Ernie has a tremendous commitment to County Fermanagh and we are delighted he has joined the Trust. Ernie is no stranger to the Trust and has been actively involved in the Fermanagh Trust through the work of the Fisher Foundation.

The Fisher Foundation was established seven years ago and has awarded approximately £200,000 in grants to support voluntary work overseas and also motor sport safety initiatives. In addition to the work of the Foundation Ernie has a long involvement in community life in North Fermanagh through his involvement in a number of organisations including both Ballinamallard Development Association and Ballinamallard Enterprise Company.

Ballinamallard Enterprise Company was established in 1998 to promote economic development through the provision of affordable workspace units and create much needed community facilities in the Ballinamallard area. In 2007 the company opened a new phase, which brought the total number of workspace units provided by the group to nine. The provision of these units has been successful, bringing much needed employment and necessary services to the local community.

In addition the Company plan to use the rental income generated to support further projects within the village of Ballinamallard in the future.

The other Trustees are Joanna McVey (Chair), Frank McManus (Vice-Chairman), Kathleen Richey (Secretary), Jim Ledwith, Aideen McGinley and David Bolton. The Trust's work is also supported by a number of advisory panels, which guide and support various projects.

### £2.1 million secured for Fermanagh Trust Shared Education Programme

**The Fermanagh Trust has received support totalling £2.1 million to implement a Shared Education Programme in Fermanagh over the next three years**

Funding has been secured from the International Fund for Ireland and Atlantic Philanthropies towards a county wide Shared Education initiative involving both primary and post primary schools across Fermanagh.

The schools in the County have welcomed this new and exciting initiative, which provides grant aid to enable them to undertake joint curricular activities, on a cross community basis.

When the Programme opened in February of this year, the Trust was immediately inundated with applications from schools seeking to undertake joint educational projects with pupils from their neighbouring school (of a different community background). To date, a total of 28 projects have been approved for funding, involving 34 primary schools in the County (and 2 schools from across the border) and 5 post-primary schools. Over 1,500 primary school pupils and 160 post-primary pupils are expected to benefit from the Shared Education experience, in the first year alone. In all, the schools will receive a boost in funding of over £320k during the 2009-2010 academic year - a significant additional investment in education in Fermanagh and a welcome spin-off for the local economy, during the current economic climate.

## Joan Trimble Awards Scheme

Following a review of the work of the Joan Trimble Awards Scheme, a number of organisations from across Fermanagh applied for awards for the 2010 / 2011 funds. Everyone involved in the advisory panel was delighted to be in a position to support three very distinct projects;

- The Erne School has received an award of £1,890 towards a music and drama project under the theme of inclusion and diversity.
- The Fermanagh County Museum has received an award of £1,850 towards an intergenerational photographic project with members of the Young Friends of Fermanagh County Museum. The end project will be an exhibition called 'Shooting the Past' in March 2011.
- The Joan Trimble Awards will also continue to provide support towards the Fermanagh Feis master classes and workshop series in 2010. Over recent years the Fermanagh Feis with the support of a Joan Trimble Award has provided an important opportunity for school children of all ages from across Fermanagh to access high quality tuition and are delighted to support this work next year.

## Fermanagh Trust Grants

The Fermanagh Trust recently announced a number of grant awards to local community and voluntary groups from across Fermanagh.

The awards include a grant of £2,500 to Donagh Development Association to develop a community garden with individual allotments and a seated area, which will become a focal point for the local community. Though this social and environmental project is at an early stage of its development the Association have made great progress over recent months actively engaging with the wider community and a number of local organisations who are both supportive of the project and committed to getting involved.

The Trust also awarded a grant of £1,000 to the Ely Centre in Enniskillen towards the cost of purchasing wheel chairs to assist members during group outings and project visits. The Inniskillings Museum received an award of £400 towards the cost of organising an exhibition called Chaplains in Conflict.

Due to the continued difficulties in the financial markets The Fermanagh Trust has recently reviewed its grant programme and policy and the grant guidelines have been amended to reflect this for further information visit [www.fermanaghtrust.org](http://www.fermanaghtrust.org)

Schools principals have expressed their enthusiasm for the initiative, reporting that it will help teachers deliver the revised Northern Ireland Curriculum, which places greater emphasis on the processes of learning and development; it will enable schools to acquire specialist expertise to strengthen the delivery of the curriculum and provide lessons in new subject areas; participant schools can gain additional resources to enhance learning; and it will contribute to the professional development of teachers, through skills and knowledge transfer from partner schools and external specialists. Most importantly, it will enhance the learning opportunities for the pupils involved.

Overall, the Programme aims to build positive relations between school communities and create the potential for future joint working, sharing and collaborating. It is hoped that the Shared Education Programme will contribute to the building of more integrative, cohesive and sustainable communities in Fermanagh.

Given their eagerness to participate, two school partnerships have already begun their Shared Education activities. St Martin's Primary School in Garrison have linked with Kilbarron National School in Ballyshannon and the pupils are engaging in the art of Story Telling and Traditional Tales. The children are researching and recording stories that have been handed down through the generations in both localities.



Belleek Primary School has joined forces with St John the Baptist Primary School, Rosscar, to jointly celebrate the 150th anniversary of the Belleek Pottery and participate in the Belleek festival. The pupils will participate in joint art and craft workshops, where they will make festival T-shirts; using tie-dye they will produce decorations and bunting for the festival; and they will make plaques made up of clay tiles, each representing key landmarks of Belleek.
